BUNCO, BUNCO, BABY!

Ever play Bunco??

The game starts when the Head table rings the bell. Players then roll the 3 dice to score points. The turn is over when the number of the round is not rolled and the dice are passed clockwise. The round is over when a team at the head table reaches 21 points or rolls a Bunco.

Points are scored depending on the number of times the round’s number is rolled. One dice with the round’s number = 1 point, Two dice with the round’s number = 2 points. Three dice or 3 of a kind of any number other than the round’s number = 5 points. Three of a kind of the round’s number = 21 points and Bunco!



When Bunco is called, the team earns 21 points but only the player who rolled it gets to place a check next to the Bunco section of the scorecard.

At the end of the round the teams with the highest points claims a win in that round and the teams with the lowest score takes the loss. The losing team from the Head table moves to the Lowest table. The winner from the lowest move to the middle and the winners from the middle move to the Head table and partners are switched. The next round starts with the ringing of the bell with the number being the next one in line.

Confused? A little? You’ll be fine! Stop in the first Tuesday of every month. It’s fun. It’s easy. And your friends are here too.
